


Inspired Artisans Announces Latest Commission in Fort Lee, NJ

Each mosaic will depict a saint: St. Martin de Porres (*shown in photo*), St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Patrick, St. Andrew Kim Taegon and St. Nicholas di Bari.

Gianfranco Tassara, owner of Inspired Artisans, thanks Fr. Stephen Carey and Gregory Lopez for putting their trust and faith in them to complete this important commission. The mosaics will be hand-crafted in Italy and installed in the mausoleum addition once it is completed.

The photo below is of a project completed in late 2012 at Holyhood Catholic Cemetery in Seattle, WA. The object was to produce a near duplication of a portrait of Our Lady of Sorrows. According to Nielsen, "This particular project was unique as it solved a problem - 'How do we use a blank wall with no depth to create a marketable space that is beautiful and functional?'"



Oregon Memorials used a blend of technique and product to produce these 4" thick niches. The shutters are Jerusalem Gold marble trimmed with Classic Verdi marble. The Glass Art® image of Our Sorrowful Mother was applied to a slab of green granite."
